DO YOU REMEMBER ESMERELDA AND HER DAUGHTERS?

Esmerelda entered our Family Preservation Program with her four daughters a few years ago, after going through some **unthinkable challenges.**

She has two daughters with special needs, a teenager with muscular dystrophy, and a young daughter who was born blind.

Her husband was then murdered, leaving her as a single mom trying to care for her children.

This setback left them living in a one-room home, with no bathroom, by a river, in what is called a "Bordo," which are slum communities that border river lines, always controlled by a gang.

To get to and out of their home that bordered the river, they had to walk up a steep mud ravine. As Jenifer's (her daughter with MS) condition worsened, Esmerelda had to carry her up the ravine. Ultimately, after a surgery, Esmeralda could no longer physically carry her and her wheelchair to the road to get her out of the house.

BUT...their desperate situation was met with a life plan from our Family Preservation Director, where he worked on developing a plan to make sure that poverty would not tear this family apart. heir holistic life plan also included life coaching, personal financial planning, a business plan, parent coaching, and psychological and spiritual support to thrive as a family.

We are excited to share that thanks to donors committed to seeing this family positioned for success and the diligent work of our Family Preservation Director, this family has spent the quarantine in their new home that is wheelchair friendly and where the family is thriving!

We are also extremely grateful for the timing of this because, with the arrival of Hurricane Eta, they would have been left completely stranded and without a home as the river rose past their old house.

HURRICANE ETA RELIEF FOR HONDURAS

November 4th, Hurricane Eta made landfall in Honduras. It dropped enormous amounts of rain throughout the country and caused country-wide landslides and mudslides, road and bridges collapsed and were wiped out, and rainwater overflowed rivers and completely flooded entire communities. It left entire communities of thousands of homes and businesses and entirely devastated some of the country's most underprivileged communities. Thousands of families were left trapped on the roofs of their homes, with all of their belongings destroyed inside.

Keep in mind, these thousands of families are families who live in poverty. They have worked and saved for years to obtain the little that they had. There is no home insurance to help replace and repair. Additionally, these are families who have been deeply affected by the economic impact of COVID-19. Without having work or an income for seven months, the arrival of Hurricane Eta couldn't have come at a worse time for so many.

However, we are thankful to share that all of the families in both our family preservation and foster care program are safe!

So what are we as Identity Mission doing, and what can you do?

As Identity, we are committed to serving at-risk families so that their families are not torn apart by the impact of poverty through our family preservation program, and we are committed to responding, through foster care, when a child loses their family.

Our response will be two-fold:

- 1. We will be responding to emergency needs as we assess longterm aid. We will meet emergency needs as we are able, we will primarily be focusing on the long-term recovery for families.
- 2. As the water subsides and the damage is assessed, we will be able to care for more families on their road to recovery and regain stability through our family preservation program.
