

# WHAT IS AHEAD IN 2020 FOR IDENTITY MISSION?

This month, all of the Identity Mission staff gathered together for a two-day planning retreat. It was a productive time where we were able to reflect on 2019, unite in our common mission, and set clear goals for 2020.

I want to share some of those goals with you in hopes that you will join us in praying and trusting the Lord that His hands will be upon each staff member and that He will take each plan and adjust and mold it to be His perfect will for our work here in Honduras.

#### Some highlights from our 2020 goals are:

- To engage and partner with the community through more local, Honduran pastors and churches to support local foster families and children and the movement as a whole. Our strategy to build our reach in this area is by establishing recruiting teams. Current staff members are taking on the responsibilities of improving our recruiting methods of both foster families and supportive partner churches!
- To improve on our organizational structure, this year, we are establishing the new position of regional directors for the Comayagua and San Pedro Sula regions. This is a role adjustment for current staff members that will now oversee office and administration needs in their region, as well as continue in their current role. Douglas Barahona will be our Regional Director in the Comayagua region, and Erica and Stephen Switzer will oversee the office in San Pedro Sula.
- We are embarking on the large endeavor to establish a system of monitoring and evaluating our services and programs. We want to ensure that every one of our programs is effective and accomplishing their purposes.



- Another monumental goal for 2020 is to finetuning our platform for training and the training sessions we offer. In foster care, that will be finalizing our foster family training manual and adding new topics to our current provided areas of training. We are also planning to offer new training to our local authority members, such as judges, police officers, etc. that will bring light to the life of a vulnerable child and best practices in responding to their needs.
- Finally, thanks to all of the generous partners and advocates for vulnerable children and families, we're planning to double our efforts in both foster care and family preservation.

While our entire team is committed to seeing and striving toward 2020 being the best year yet in serving here in Honduras, we also believe that Jesus has already FINISHED the work ahead of us. And we are so grateful that you are walking it out with us!

But, you have chosen to change these statistics by aligning with Identity Mission as we work to implement family-based care solutions for orphans in Honduras. As you know, Identity Mission fights orphanhood by #1-implementing a formal foster care program and #2-Preventing orphans altogether through the Family Preservation program that partners with struggling parents and provides solutions to prevent separation of the family unit.

You have chosen to make your stand in Honduras, and honestly, if we all would advocate and fight for the right of a child to grow up in a family from wherever and with whomever God has connected us, then we could truly see the day that orphanages are no longer the primary answer for a vulnerable child, that biological families receive the support they need, and that there are enough caring, Christian families to fill in the gap and to care for children when they do have to be separated from their families. If we each do our part, then together, we can reach the ends of the earth with the solutions needed to end the age of children growing up without a family.
